

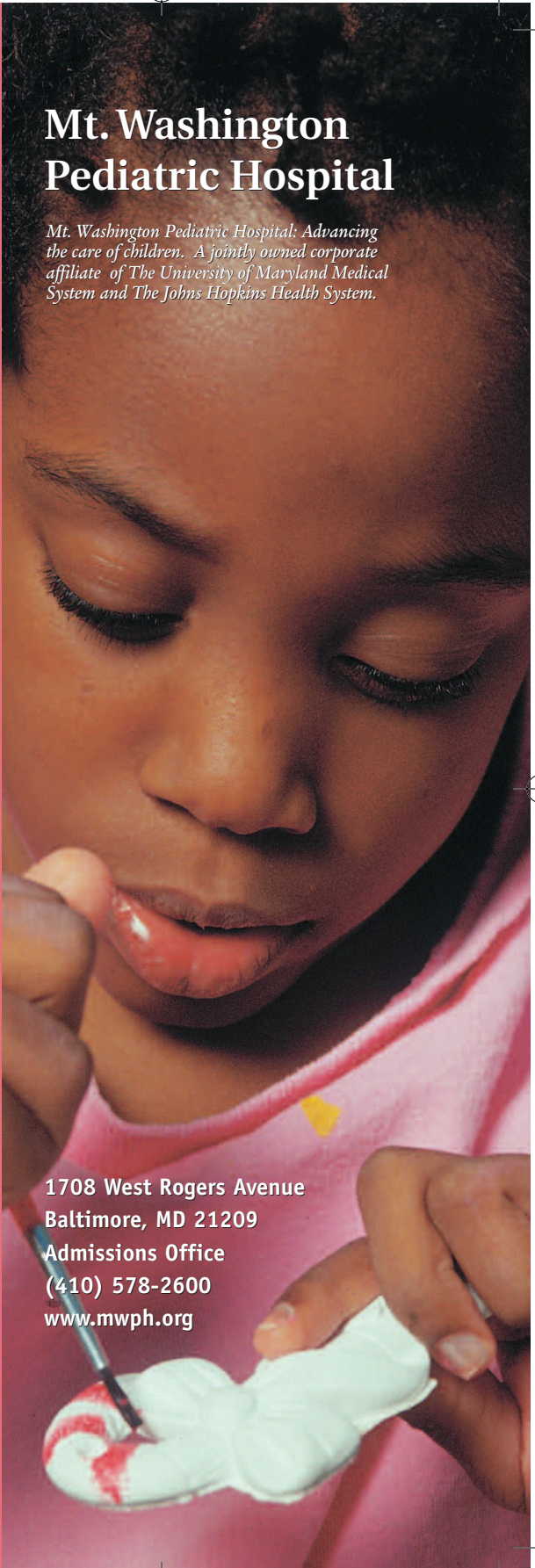

Center for Pediatric and Adolescent Rehabilitation (CPAR)

Mt. Washington Pediatric Hospital provides complete inpatient services for your child following injury, surgery or illness at its newly renovated, state of the art facility. The primary focus of the inpatient program is to help your child improve function and to prepare for the return to home, school, and your community. This is done with your family's involvement in decisions, care and training with expert pediatric staff.

Depending on your child's needs, the rehabilitation program focuses on mobility, activities of daily living, communication, memory and social interaction. If necessary, specialized technology and equipment are used to help your child function as independently as possible.

Rehabilitation Day Treatment and Outpatient Services

Mt. Washington Pediatric Hospital provides high-quality, comprehensive rehabilitation services for children in an outpatient setting. In Day Treatment, children learn and work in a supportive environment structured much like a typical school day. Individual and group activities are combined with medical therapies and education, when appropriate. A variety of outpatient medical and rehab specialties are available. All therapy programs are individualized to meet each child's needs.

Recognized Leader

Mt. Washington Pediatric Hospital prides itself on being a leader in pediatric rehabilitation.

Here's how we rank:

- CARF (The Rehabilitation Accreditation Commission) accreditation has been awarded to the inpatient program at Mt. Washington Pediatric Hospital for Medical Rehabilitation and Pediatric Family-Centered Care.
- The vast majority of our children (95%) complete their therapy program and return home. The remaining children (5%) require additional treatments at an acute care facility.
- Our patients' lengths of hospitalization are below the national average.
- The improvements in a child's functional skills from admission to discharge meet or exceed the national average.
- Post-hospitalization surveys indicate that our children are involved in school and community activity.
